Introduction

A Guide to Oral History Collections in Louisiana provides access to more than 7,500 oral history interviews held in thirty-three institutions scattered across the state. Louisiana's rich cultural heritage as the cradle of jazz, along with the confluence of French, Spanish, African, and Anglo cultures makes it a uniquely fruitful field for the collection of oral history. The paucity of traditional documentation and the strong oral traditions of the region's Cajun and African-American communities further enhances the value of tape-recorded narratives, and many oral history projects have been conducted in Louisiana in recent years. Too often, however, the results of these efforts have been consigned to the desk drawers of their collectors or the shelves of local libraries, unpublicized and uncataloged. These interviews contain unique and valuable information about the region's past, details recorded only in the memories of the narrators. Their stories have been rescued from one sort of oblivion only to be consigned to another. The survey on which this guide is based, revealed vividly how under utilized these rich and evocative sources are.

We hope that our publication of A Guide to Oral History Collections in Louisiana will be a major step toward remedying this situation, maximizing the use of existing sources and encouraging researchers to build on rather than duplicate the work of others. In addition to making existing interviews more accessible to potential users, we hope the publication of this work will:

- > Increase awareness of the value of oral history materials;
- > Encourage classroom use of oral history materials by elementary and secondary school teachers who are looking for innovative ways to interest their students in history by publicizing local collections. Hearing the voices of people talking about their own experiences bridges the gap between classroom and the "real world" and makes students aware that history is not remote and abstract but something in which they and their families and neighbors participate every day.
- > Publicize the existence of this material beyond the boundaries of Louisiana as well as within the state by making the guide available to other local, state, and regional libraries, historical societies and manuscript and oral history repositories;

- > Provide minimal level descriptions of holdings for institutions that lack them in a format that will be readily transferable to national archival data bases;
- > Encourage contacts and exchange of information among collectors and repositories by including contact names, addresses, phone numbers and other access information;
- > And increase holdings of oral history materials by encouraging collectors to deposit their work in appropriate repositories.

The T. Harry Williams Center for Oral History, an independent, interdisciplinary program, was established at LSU in 1991 to collect, preserve, and disseminate the oral history of Louisiana and her people. The Center is housed in Hill Memorial Library, LSU's special collections facility, where the staff of the manuscript department handles all cataloging and public access for our collection. We serve the faculty, researchers, and students of LSU by providing workshops, classes, and technical assistance to those who wish to use oral history methodology in their own research or to incorporate oral history materials into classroom or other projects. As a program of the state's flagship university, we share LSU's mandate to serve the entire state, and assist and encourage individuals and groups throughout Louisiana to collect and use oral history. We consider the publication of this guide to be a significant part of fulfilling that mandate.

This project began in 1992 when we decided to update an earlier guide to sources of oral history in the state, Hubert Humphreys' *Louisiana Oral History Collections: A Directory*, which was published more that fifteen years ago at LSU-Shreveport. Kind fate brought us David Richards, then a graduate student in the LSU School of Library and Information Science. Working as an independent study student, Richards conducted a statewide survey of repositories to determine what oral materials had been collected since Humphreys' work came out in 1980. He designed a survey form that we mailed to all college and university libraries, public libraries, and historical and genealogical societies in the state, asking basic information about the repository itself and its holdings. The responses to the survey, supplemented by Richard's numerous follow-up telephone calls and on-site visits, confirmed the necessity of updating the earlier directory. It revealed that 5,000 interviews had been added to the approximately 2,500 Humphreys' had

found, while the number of repositories had nearly doubled, from seventeen to thirty-three.

In the short period dictated by the independent study rubric under which he was working, David Richards did a remarkable job of organizing this new information about the repositories, creating series descriptions based on their responses to his survey and preparing a subject index. But this was not a project that could be completed in a semester, not even when stretched into the summer and supplemented by the many evening and weekend hours Richards put in to it. When he graduated and took a position at the University of Southern Mississippi, the guide languished until the spring of 1995 when Tara Zachary, a graduate student in history and library science and a research assistant at the Williams Center, took over.

Zachary spent the next six months integrating data from Humphreys' work with that which Richards' had prepared, checking again with many of the repositories to clarify, expand, and update their responses, and in some cases helping their staff identify and describe their oral history materials for the first time. Her dedication and efficiency ensured that the merging process resulted in a document characterized by consistency, clarity and minimal duplication.

The Williams Center for Oral History is named for T. Harry Williams, LSU professor of history and pioneer oral historian, whose Pulitzer Prize winning biography of Huey Long was based on nearly 300 tape recorded interviews. The Williams Center is proud to offer this *Guide to Oral History Collections in Louisiana* as part of our effort to carry on Williams' work of collecting and preserving the rich and varied history of our state; we hope that it will inspire others to listen to the voices of Louisiana and her people.

On behalf of the Williams Center, I want to thank David Richards and Tara Zachary for their extraordinary commitment to this project and the superb work they have done. Both worked with minimal supervision and demonstrated the imagination, initiative, and meticulous attention to detail that characterize good archivists. The LSU School of Library and Information Science can be proud to claim them as alumni and their future employers will be fortunate to have them. The Williams Center certainly was.

How to Use This Guide

The information in this guide includes repository descriptions, collection descriptions, and interviewee, interviewer, and subject indexes. Because the different institutions of the state have varying degrees of intellectual and physical control over their oral history holdings, the descriptions are sometimes uneven in their detail. Some repositories had only the name of the interviewer and the topics covered in a collection; others had only lists of interviewees; and still others had complete transcripts and extensive finding aids. To the degree possible we have standardized format and depth of description.

Repository and collection descriptions are arranged alphabetically by repository. Where one institution houses more than one repository, we considered the public's point of access to determine whether the repository merited its own entry or one under the institution's name. For example, the Amistad Research Center, Newcomb College Center for Research on Women, the Hogan Jazz Archives and the Tulane Manuscripts Collection are all located on the Tulane campus. But Amistad and Newcomb are housed in separate buildings, while the university's Manuscripts Collection and Hogan Jazz Archive are located in the library. Within the library, each of the latter have their own public services desks. Thus, the Amistad and Newcomb centers are listed under their own names, while the Manuscripts Collection and Hogan Jazz Archives are found alphabetically under Tulane with separate collections descriptions. One the other hand, access to the holdings of the T. Harry Williams Center for Oral History is provided by the staff of LSU's Louisiana and Lower Mississippi Valley Collection (LLMVC) in the Special Collections Library, so the Center's interviews are described as part of the university's holdings, rather than as a repository in its own right.

We have assigned an identification number to each repository and collection within it. For example, in 14-10, fourteen refers to the repository, Louisiana State University-Baton Rouge, LLMVC, and ten refers to the Voices of American Homemakers Oral History Project. This numbering system has been used in all of the indexes; that is, the numbers refer to the collections and series as described in this guide, not to page numbers nor to any internal collection numbers of individual repositories.

Repository information includes the name, address, telephone and fax number, E-mail address, hours of operation, contact person, total number of interviews, available formats and finding aids, access restrictions, purpose of program, general holdings, and notable holdings. At the collection level, descriptions include the number of interviews, time period covered by interviews, dates when the interviews were conducted, principle interviewers, available finding aids, and a general description of the subject matter covered by the collection.

We based both the repository and collection descriptions on the information provided by the surveyed institution. Information was drawn from brochures and introductions in guides or finding aids, as well as our survey forms. When a collection included interviews conducted for a book, we often consulted the book itself for descriptive information.

Please note that institutions have different means of counting the number of interviews. For example, some repositories count ten interviews with one person as a single interview, while other programs treat such a collection as ten separate interviews.

The interviewee index lists the names of individuals whose interviews are included in the guide (over 4,000 entries), indexed to repository and collection. A list of interviewees for each collection is also included in the collection description. Where published guides to specific collections are available, however, we have not listed the interviewee's names in the collection description or the interviewee index. Instead, citations to the published guides are provided and researchers are urged to contact the repository.

The interviewer index consists of over 250 interviewers indexed to repository and collection. These reflect only the major interviewers reported by the repositories; we do not suggest that this list is inclusive. Interviewee and interviewer names, including the spelling thereof, are based on information provided by the repositories. We tried to discern whether similar names with different spellings provided by different repositories referred to the same person, but again we make no claims for accuracy.

The subject index is based on Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH). These headings were designed to standardize subject cataloging for published books, and anyone who has worked with manuscripts and other unpublished or non-print materials knows that the fit is at best an imperfect one. Nonetheless, in order to make our data as compatible as possible with

national data bases, we have adhered to LCSH standards as much as possible. For terms not sufficiently covered by LCSH, we relied on the local authority file established by LLMVC. The subject index includes references to personal names, corporate names, general subjects (topical terms), and geographical areas. General terms and those that relate to all of Louisiana have no geographic subdivisions. The name of an individual interviewee is included in the subject index only when that person is the principle subject of a collection. Refer to the interviewee or interviewer index to locate interviews with or conducted by specific individuals. Again, names of institutions, organizations, and persons are identified as given by the repository.
