BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

The Louisiana State University College of Agriculture was established in 1908, although the study of agriculture had always been part of the university's curriculum and departments for horticulture (1886), entomology (1889), agronomy (1907), and plant pathology (1907) predated the foundation of the college. Departments were formed later in animal husbandry (1908), agricultural engineering (1919), dairy science (1921), forestry (1926), vocational education (1936), agricultural economics and agribusiness (1937), poultry science (1949), food science and technology (1962), experimental statistics (1964), and landscape architecture (1964).

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This record group consists of clippings, correspondence, meeting minutes, photographs, printed items, reports, topical files, and writings pertaining to the administrative operations of the College of Agriculture. Clippings consist of articles from newspapers and other periodicals on topics such as the success of the "greater university," as the LSU's new campus was called; William Dodson's departure from the College of Agriculture, farmers' response to the news, and Dodson's return to LSU; agriculture policy in Louisiana; tick eradication; and other articles on agriculture. Correspondence pertains to such topics as the purchase of Williams Plantation for LSU's new campus, the Animal Industry Livestock Development Program, and the Dairy Improvement Center. Correspondence was exchanged with various campus entities such as the Office of the Dean of Men, President's Office, agricultural experiment stations around the state, and state cooperative extension offices, as well as with foreign visitors to campus and the U.S. Department of Agriculture and other government agencies involving programs for foreign visitors. Meeting minutes consist of those from the Agricultural Student Council, the Agricultural Fair Association, the Louisiana Farm Council, general faculty meetings and meetings of department heads in the College of Agriculture; and the Farm Services Department. Photographs consist of a portrait of William C. Stubbs, a panoramic view of the downtown campus, a group photograph of faculty, legislators, and their families at the Indian Mounds; and a group photo of the faculty from 1899. Printed items consist of a scroll honoring William Dodson for fifty years of service to agriculture in Louisiana and posters about programs in the College of Agriculture. Reports consist of those from the Department of Animal Industry's Livestock Development Program and Livestock Improvement Program, the Dairy Improvement Center, and projects from various departments within the College of Agriculture. Topical files include information on the needs and conditions of buildings within the scope of the College of Agriculture such as the John M. Parker Coliseum, Knapp Hall, Stubbs Hall, and the creamery; the purchase of Williams Plantation and the construction of buildings comprising the present campus; budgetary issues for various departments within the college; faculty, staff, and student involvement in such organizations as the Agricultural Economics Association, Block and Bridle, the Dairy Club, Future Farmers of American, the Home Economics Club, the Louisiana Farm Council, and others; and administrative records pertaining to the operation of departments such as Agronomy, Dairy, Forestry, Horticulture, Rural Development Program, Soil Conservation, and agricultural experiment stations around the state. Writings include speeches and essays written by William R. Dodson on agricultural education, the history of sugar cane in Louisiana, and agriculture along Bayou Teche; and incomplete writings pertaining to Dodson's family and various topics on agriculture in Louisiana.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Series I. Clippings, 1919-1949, undated.

Arranged chronologically, this series consists of newspaper articles on William Dodson's resignation as dean of the College of Agriculture in 1919 and his return in 1921, praise for the work of the College, and the constitutional convention of 1921 and how it affected the establishment of the new LSU campus. Other articles pertain to tick eradication, cattle breeds for southern farms, and the establishment of a frozen food locker plant in New Iberia, LA.

Series II. Correspondence, 1918-1957.

Arranged alphabetically by the topic or the entity to which the correspondence refers then chronologically, this series consists of letters, telegrams, and memorandums among faculty, staff, and administrators in the departments of Agronomy and Horticulture on administrative matters and day-to-day activities of the departments; correspondence on the establishment and operation of the Animal Industry Livestock Development Program, Livestock Improvement Program, and the Dairy Improvement Center; and correspondence between College of Agriculture administration and staff at the state experiment stations pertaining to their operation. Other correspondence includes requests for information on agriculture programs and research and permission to visit campus from foreign visitors; correspondence with the United States Department of Agriculture and the College of Agriculture to establish itineraries for foreign visitors; correspondence with entities such as the Hawaiian Sugar Planters Association, Louisiana Delta Council, Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, and Future Farmers of America requesting information; letters acknowledging the service of various staff members in the College of Agriculture for their service to organizations, and memberships in the organizations; and correspondence regarding vending machines and their use and placement on campus, the new golf course, high school visits, and scholarships.

Series III. Meeting Minutes, 1942-1957.

Arranged alphabetically by the name of the entities holding the meetings then chronologically, this series consists of minutes of meetings held by Agricultural Fair Association of Students, the Agricultural Student Council, Computer Facilities Committee, Improvement of Teaching Committee, Student Counseling and Advisement Committee, Louisiana Farm Council, faculty meetings, and others.

Series IV. Photographs, 1899-1918, undated.

Arranged chronologically, this series consists of a group photograph LSU's faculty from 1899, a panoramic photograph of the downtown campus from c. 1906, a group photograph from 1918 of LSU's faculty members and state legislators and their families at the Indian Mounds on the present campus, and an undated portrait of William C. Stubbs.

Series V. Printed Items, 1944, 1986-1987, undated.

Arranged chronologically, this series contains a scroll honoring William Dodson for fifty years of service to agriculture in Louisiana from 1944 and posters advertising agriculture as a major, graduate fellowships, and activities commemorating World Food Day.

Series VI. Reports, circa 1927-1957.

Arranged alphabetically by the name of the reporting body then chronologically, this series consists of financial reports and budgets from the Livestock Improvement Program and the Dairy Improvement Center; reports used in compiling semester and biennial budgets; vehicle and farm equipment inventories; reports on maintenance and repair needs for buildings operated by the College of Agriculture; and reports on vocational education, student registration, and international programs. Also included are project records on various experimental projects in the College of Agriculture such as corn, cotton, sugar cane, and sugar beet varieties; use of motorized farm equipment; nutrition research; and diseases in farm crops and animals.

Series VII. Topical Files, 1918-1959.

Arranged alphabetically by topic, this series contains information on student organizations such as the Dairy Club, Future Farmers of America, Home Economics Club, and the Poultry Science Club. Also included is information on local and regional organizations such as the American Sugar Cane League, the Louisiana Cattleman's Association, the Louisiana Farm Council, the National Cotton Foundation of America, and the National Science Foundation and their interactions with the College of Agriculture. Other records pertain to building needs such as air conditioning, general maintenance, and remodeling along with building use by various organizations. Records on administrative issues in the departments within the College of Agriculture include directives and approvals for various projects from the Dean of Administration, Dean of the Graduate School, Dean of the University, and Comptroller; agreements between the College of Agriculture and the US Department of Agriculture pertaining to foreign educational programs; and records concerning the purchase of Williams Plantation for LSU's new campus, the Rural Development Program, soil conservation, and vocational education.

Series VIII. Writings, 1921-1922, undated.

Arranged alphabetically by title then chronologically, this series consists of papers, articles, and speeches written by William Dodson. Topics include the history of sugar cane in Louisiana, agricultural education, the new LSU campus and agricultural education. This series also contains incomplete writings on tick eradication, the new campus, and the birthdates and places of Dodson's children.
